Check-In, Check-out, Rosters:

- To check in, each unit is required to submit 2 copies of their roster. No exceptions.
- All participants must have Medical parts A and B. Medicals will be retained by the unit for safekeeping.
- Unit leaders must notify the health officer of any scouts or adults with special needs, medical issues, or mobility concerns.
- Day visitors must check in at Camporee HQ before going to their respective sites.
- Check in will occur at the Flintlock building near the parking lot Friday evening and Saturday morning.
- <u>All sites will be inspected</u> before your unit checks out. Please call Marc or Katie

Parking, Traffic, Trailers & Vehicles:

- All vehicles will park in the camp's parking lot except 'bear vehicle and trailer).
- Each vehicle will post the owner's contact information on the dash. Please follow all parking rules.
- **Carpooling is imperative**. Please limit the number of vehicles parking at the event as much as possible.
- ONLY 1 vehicle/trailer per unit may park at its campsite. If there is no room due to your unit sharing the site with another unit, please work with the other unit(s) at your site.
- Don't block the camp road.
- The camp ranger has the final say on the use of the camp road for trailers/vehicles pending weather conditions.

Health, Safety, and Identification:

- Follow the buddy system!
- Unit leaders must notify the health officer of any Scouts or adults with special needs, medical issues, or mobility concerns.
- All injuries must be reported to staff. Scoutmasters are to fill out incident reports and submit them to council.
- Staff EMTs (Deb Reidmiller 973-903-6939) will be available for the duration of the event and will maintain a FA log.
- The closest hospital is: St. Clare's Hospital, <u>25 Pocono Rd, Denville, N.J. 07834</u>. If <u>you have an emergency please call Marc</u> 973-900-0919 or Ranger Curt, at 518-321-4356. If you call 911 directly it will cause confusion when they arrive and will delay response!
- <u>In case of inclement weather, please follow the directions of the staff.</u> Lightning storms units should seek protection in dining hall or cabins or under pavilions.
- <u>Lost Scouts!</u> Upon notification of a lost Scout, an alert will be sent to all unit leadership with instructions.
- <u>Lost and found</u> will be at the camporee headquarters.

- Wristbands will be issued to all participants.

Camping:

- Campsite will be assigned at check-in. Due to other activities at WSR campsites may be shared.
- Your unit MUST check in at the camporee HQ before setting up camp.
- Each camping area will be managed by the camporee staff.
- The unit should properly mark its site with its unit's flag.
- Be sure to follow the rules in The Guide to Safe Scouting.
- Follow the "Leave No Trace" philosophy while camping.
- Respect other units around you as some units will be sharing sites.
- No restrictions on cooking or campfires unless directed by camp ranger.
- Be sure to have, 'in public view,' a first aid kit and fire extinguisher in your site.
- Scouts and Scouters should show respect in using latrines. Please do not throw trash in the latrines.
- Be prepared to carry your personal gear to your site.
- Advise staff if you are leaving early.

Garbage, Trash and Grey Water:

- Garbage and Trash Follow LEAVE NO TRACE. Use the dumpster or pack it out.
- All "grey water" should be disposed of properly.

Meals:

• Units are responsible for their own meals.

Campfires in site:

- Build campfires in established fire pits
- Appoint a unit fire marshal.
- Never leave your campfire unattended.
- Bring water and a shovel for throwing dirt on a fire if it gets out of control.
- Drown the fire with water at lights out.
- Make sure all embers, coals and sticks are wet.
- Stir the remains, add more water and stir again.
- Be sure all burned material has been extinguished and cooled before your fire marshal goes to sleep

Uniforms:

• Scout Class B uniform shirt is acceptable.

• Units should prepare a skit or song to perform during the campfire.

What Not To Bring:

- a) No Smoking ANYWHERE in camp where Scouts can see you.
- b) No alcoholic beverages of any type.
- c) No dogs or animals of any type except for service animals.
- d) No firearms, sheath knives or fireworks.

- Leave no Trace.
- Outdoor Ethics.



The Saturday Program (7 Stations):

General - The program day will run from 9 am to 4 pm with an hour out for lunch. Please arrive on time and depart on time. Each program area will be one half hour in duration and assignments will be made to accommodate all units as best as possible. Smaller units may be combined for program activities.

- New Jersey Forest Fire (ONLY AT EVENT UNTILL NOON)
 - Will be displaying its equipment
 - brush truck, personal gear, possible helicopter fly over
 - All dependent on the severity of fire season at that date.

 - Will be displaying an ambulance and the equipment on it.
- Morris County Sheriff's Office
 - Bomb Squad, K-9 Unit, Emergency Service Unit (ESU)
 - will be doing demonstrations of services
- Rockaway Township Fire Department, Marcela Company
 - Will be displaying its equipment
- Andover Township Fire Department
 - Will be displaying its equipment
 - Will be allowing Scouts to pick up eggs off cones with the Jaws of Life.
